holds up

Meaning: Remains strong, reliable, or respected over time.

Examples:

- His argument **holds up** even after more research.
- Having McDonald's on your resume **holds up** well as proof of good experience.

change of pace

Meaning: A different or new experience compared to usual activities.

Examples:

- After working in an office, moving to a farm was a real **change of pace**.
- I usually study at home, so going to a café is a nice change of pace.

find

Meaning: To realize or believe something after experiencing it.

Examples:

- I find this book very interesting.
- She **found** that learning a new language takes time and practice.

CV

Meaning: A document that lists your work experience and skills when applying for a job. **Examples:**

- He updated his **CV** before applying for a new job.
- A strong CV can help you get hired faster.

as a reference

Meaning: Something used as proof or support when applying for a job.

Examples:

- She used her old manager as a reference for her new job.
- Having experience at McDonald's looks good as a reference on your CV.

serving customers

Meaning: Helping and providing service to people in a store, restaurant, or business.

Examples:

- He enjoys serving customers at the café.
- Working in retail means spending a lot of time **serving customers**.
