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physically competent

**Meaning:** Having good physical skills and the ability to handle physical tasks well.

**Examples:** 

• People who grow up on farms tend to be more **physically competent** because

they do a lot of manual work.

• She is very **physically competent**, so she excels at sports and outdoor

activities.

whereas

**Meaning:** Used to contrast two different things.

**Examples:** 

• He enjoys outdoor activities, whereas I prefer staying indoors.

My cousins grew up on a farm, whereas I grew up in a big city.

maneuvering around

**Meaning:** Moving or finding one's way through a place or situation.

**Examples:** 

• He had trouble **maneuvering around** the crowded streets of New York.

• Farmers are comfortable working in open fields, but they may struggle

maneuvering around in big cities.

resilient

**Meaning:** Able to recover quickly from difficulties; strong and adaptable.

**Examples:** 

• People who work on farms are often very **resilient** because they deal with tough

conditions.

• She faced many challenges, but she remained **resilient** and never gave up.

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#### squeamish

**Meaning:** Easily uncomfortable or scared, especially about blood, injuries, or unpleasant things.

#### **Examples:**

- I feel **squeamish** when I see blood.
- He is **squeamish** about touching insects, but his cousin loves playing with them.

#### diligent

**Meaning:** Hardworking and careful in completing tasks.

## **Examples:**

- She is very **diligent** in her studies and always submits her homework on time.
- Farmers have to be **diligent** to make sure all their animals are fed properly.

#### in some ways, in other ways

**Meaning:** Used to compare different aspects of something.

### **Examples:**

- In some ways, living on a farm is fun, but in other ways, it is very hard work.
- **In some ways**, moving to a city was exciting, but **in other ways**, it was overwhelming.
