**Examples:** 

• If someone doesn't treat you well, it's best to **let them go**.

• She didn't want to **let him go**, but she knew it was the right decision.

**Meaning:** A different form or version of something.

**Examples:** 

• Most love stories are **some variation of** "boy meets girl, they fall in love, and

something happens."

Every culture has some variation of traditional dance.

**Meaning:** Both people or groups involved in something.

## **Examples:**

- Both parties need to communicate well for a relationship to work.
- In business deals, **both parties** must agree on the contract terms.
