**Meaning:** That describes who I am or my situation. **Examples:** 

- 1. I like simple living—that's me.
- 2. I prefer renting. **That's me** for now.

#### 7. on my side

**Meaning:** My responsibility or part of the situation. **Examples:** 

- 1. If something breaks, it's not **on my side** to fix it.
- 2. There's less pressure on my side as a tenant.
